I solicit the support of all our members in strengthening the specialty and contributing towards the cancer cure of the country.



Obituary to Dr Devendra D Patel

Professor Devendra D Patel (15/9/1932 - 5/4/2022)







It is indeed a matter of great honour and a privilege for IASO to have been closely associated with Prof. Dr. Devendra D. Patel, who is widely recognized both nationally & internationally as a "LEGEND" in the field of Surgical Oncology.

After completing his MBBS (1956) and MS in General Surgery (1959) from BJ Medical College (Gujarat), he went to the UK and passed FRCS from the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of England & Edinburgh (1964). Having obtained advanced subspecialty training for two years at Lahey Clinic in Boston, he returned to India in 1966 and worked for close to four decades (1966 - 2003) at M. P. Shah Cancer Hospital. During this period, he transformed the delivery of surgical Oncology care in Gujarat, having served as Chief Surgical Oncologist, Deputy Director & Director at this Centre of excellence.

A Col. Pandalai Orator of The Association of Surgeons of India, he delivered numerous prestigious Orations at national & international conferences in addition to publishing extensively in peer-reviewed journals.

He served as President of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology (1984) & Indian Society of Oncology (1990 – 1992).

He is the only surgeon from India to be conferred the Honorary Fellowship of the British Association of Surgical Oncology, which is the voice for surgical oncology in the UK. He received the prestigious "oncology Development of India award" from late Shri Abdul Kalam (2013) for his lifetime phenomenal contribution to surgical oncology care in the Country. He is also the recipient of the prestigious award "Living Legend in Oncology" conferred upon him at the Indian Cancer Congress (2017)

A Paul Harris Fellow conferred by Rotary International for his outstanding contribution to various philanthropic initiatives, Prof. Patel has made an impactful and meaningful difference to lives of scores of less privileged people in the State of Gujarat. In recognition of his outstanding contribution to the art & science of surgical oncology & breast healthcare in India, he was conferred the prestigious Padma Shri (2017) and Dr. B.C. Roy National award (1998).

In closing, as a tribute to his incredible and yeomen contribution to the field of Surgical Oncology, the Association of Surgeons of India honoured him with Lifetime Achievement Award for the year 2020, which is the highest level of recognition conferred by the Association upon a surgeon practicing in India.

Our thoughts are with Prof. Devendra Patel's family at this most difficult time and the Membership of IASO joins us in praying for his soul to rest in peace



1. Zonal CMEs update from EC - All Zonal EC members

Dr Goud has organised couple of CMEs to aiming at skill development in medical colleges and the EC appreciated his contribution.

EC discussed conducting CME s in Srinagar and NCI Jhajjar and decision was taken to continue webinars as well.

IASO will be conducting two kinds of meeting:

Zonal CMEs, at least one activity per zone, organised by EC members involving faculty among IASO members and leadership.

The second kind of meeting is post graduate CMEs to be conducted at Medical Colleges, with specific IASO surgical oncology training modules.

EC decided to give a seed money of Rs.50,000/- for the zonal CMEs and a single financial grant of Rs.25,000/- for the PG CMEs.

The Secretary's office will further communicate EC members asking their participation in organising these events.

2. Membership drive / Associate Membership issues – Dr Chandramohan

Secretary declared present membership of 1830 surgical oncologists. He updated EC on current membership drive by reaching out to all MCh and DNB training centres, including teachers, examiners and students.

IASO secretariat to share list of members and centres with all EC members, to increase outreach and contact.

EC decided that any non-member can submit an abstract for presentation at an IASO conference but that will be considered only for poster presentation & poster awards unless the person becomes an IASO member before a stipulated time after which they are eligible to be considered for Oral presentation & awards also.

All non members & Associate members are eligible for Conference cash awards only & not designated IASO awards as listed on the website.EC also decided to have differential registration fees for members and non members.

It was also decided that Secretary should present list of newly joined members in EC meetings and in the GBM and get it endorsed by the EC and GBM. List of new members to be published in Newsletter.EC decided that PhD scientists (non MBBS) may be accepted as Associate members, after approval by EC and GBM.

3. Zone redesign – Dr Chandramohan

New zone division by Dr Chandramohan, to make Telengana and Andhra Pradesh part of East Zone, was approved by the members. To be presented in the next GB and implemented from next year.

4. Website update- Dr Geeta Kadyaprath

Dr Geeta Kadyaprath updated EC on website upgrade status and she is working along with the Secretary on completing it and going live as soon as possible.

5. Audited report from Dr Narendra- Dr Somashekhar

EC urged Dr Narendra to submit accounts.

6. Allowances for SSO for IASO office bearers

The SSO IASO partnership was lauded, and a collective decision taken to encourage and support more young members to publish and present posters at SSO forums, and SSO to provide observership experience to one young member per year.

EC has decided to support two IASO leaders to attend the SSO meetings with the financial support of 2500 USD (maximum) for reimbursing expenses incurred for travel, registration and stay.

EC decided to sort out pending issues with SSO, regarding membership fees, travelling Fellowships, reimbursements etc when Dr P K Das and Dr Chandramohan attend their physical meeting this year.

President proposed setting up collaboration with the Japanese societies and ESSO.

7. Miscellaneous points – Dr Chandramohan

Google form was designed for collecting details of existing members and it is to be circulated.

8. Selection of abstracts based on membership -Dr Arnab Gupta

EC decided that non members can submit abstracts for poster presentation only. Subsequently, if they become members within a stipulated period, they can become eligible for awards .Membership is mandatory for oral/podium presentations and designated IASO awards. EC also decided to have differential registration fees for members and non members.

Anyone as a Surgical Oncologist can submit his/her abstract. The organizing committee has to make the non members aware that their abstract will be accepted only for poster presentation, until and unless they become members of IASO.

If we make them members after the awards are declared, the awardees will only become members, the rest may not.

An Associate member or non member can get only the conference cash award. They are not eligible for the designated IASO awards.

9. IT notice 2011-12 -Dr P K Das and Dr Somashekhar

Treasurer informed that IASO never submitted ITR before 2011. As a result, there is an outstanding of INR 232976, including interest and penalty, for FY 2011-12. EC agreed to settle the dues.

10. CEN IASO matters - Dr P K Das

EC decided to wait for CEN to respond, since Dr Mark Balch has retired, and nobody has taken his place yet.

11. Rethinking on orations – Dr P K Das

This matter was already discussed and decided in 2 EC meetings, in the presence of past Presidents, and GBM 2021. Timebound donations for orations decided upon, 5 lakhs for 5 years and 10 lakhs for 10 years.

It is decided to add another donor name to existing Radha Devi Oration, subject to appropriate time bound donation, and to be passed in GBM 2022.

EC decided to continue P B Desai, Motibhai, R S Rao and N C Mishra orations for now, but maybe Motibhai Oration to be phased out in GBM 2023.

The EC decided that it is not within the jurisdiction of IASO to lay down ethical guidelines for its members.

The meeting ended with Vote of Thanks by President and President Elect.

Conference Report OF MIDCON 2022, Shillong

Conference Report

MIDCON IASO 2022

Midterm Conference of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology, 25th to 27thMarch, 2022, State Convention Centre, Shillong

The Midterm conference of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology (IASO) was held at the State Convention Centre, Shillong from 25th to 27th March, 2022. This is the first time that a major conference of the IASO was held in Northeast India, and more than 300 doctors participated in the scientific deliberations at this conference. Coming after a long hiatus of physical conferences, being curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic, it was refreshing to not only listen to the leading surgical oncologists from around the country in person but also interact personally.

While *Mesmerising Meghalaya* played a role in attracting the delegates to Shillong for the conference, it was the scientific program which eventually impressed everyone. The unique theme, 'Skill sets in Surgical Oncology', made it a pure surgical oncology conference, with all the deliberations focussing on the skills needed for a surgical oncologist, unlike other conferences wherein the multidisciplinary management of cancer is discussed.

The success of a conference may be gauged by the scientific papers being presented and MIDCON IASO 2022 was sure successful, thanks to the 189 abstracts which were presented. The IASO leadership should be commended for the push to enable maximum residents present their research from the podium and this meant that these oral presentations had to be accommodated on March 25th, wherein the pre-conference workshop was scheduled.

In an effort to allow 40 podium presentations, the day started early, with the youngsters presenting at 8am, encouraged by the sincere judges, who were all senior faculty and IASO leadership. The pre-conference workshop featured excellent videos being presented by young faculty from across the country, showcasing more than twenty procedures. This was followed by the remaining oral presentations. The judges had a tough time deciding on the winners, with the deliberations going on till 6.30pm. This was followed by the Executive Committee meeting of IASO and dinner.

On March 26th, the video presentations started at 8 am in Hall B, while the main conference started at 9am in the main hall. The grand auditorium was filled with delegates who were intently listening to the scientific presentations by expert speakers. Since skills were being discussed, there were a lot of videos interspersed, which held everyone enthralled. It helped that all the speakers were experts in their fields, coming from across the country and representing all the leading institutions of the nation.

The breaks not only served for refreshing the attendees with tea and lunch but also led to a lot of networking and camaraderie. The residents (and senior faculty-judges) though, were busy presenting the e-Posters, which were over a hundred in number. The e-Poster presentation was a learning experience for the presenters, with a lot of input being given by the erudite judges, leaving even those who did not win awards enriched. It was heartening to see people get together around the photo booth, clicking pictures and reliving memories of old.

Since a lot of topics were covered, with thoracic, gastrointestinal and genitourinary systems being covered on the day, the sessions got over only at 6.45pm. As scheduled, the inaugural program started at 7pm, with Mr. James Sangma, Honorable Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Meghalaya gracing the occasion as the chief guest. The inaugural session served to focus on the high incidence of esophageal and other tobacco-related cancers in Meghalaya, and the need to improve tobacco control. The presence of Dr. Nalin Mehta, Director, NEIGRIHMS, underlined the commitment of the institution towards cancer care. The President of IASO, Dr. Rajendra Toprani, in his address, exhorted the authorities of the state to ensure that more efforts to control cancer be taken up in Meghalaya. The dynamic Secretary of IASO, Dr. K. Chandramohan, remarked that the launch of the new association for surgical oncologists of Northeast India would go a long way in improving cancer care. The gala night showcased the sights (Wangala and Khasi dances), sounds(Aroha Choir) and tastes(Khasi delicacies in the dinner) of Meghalaya. The Aroha Choir left the delegates enthralled with their superb singing.

The scientific deliberations started at 8am on March 27th, spread over two halls, with Head and Neck in Hall A and Breast and Miscellaneous sessions in Hall B. The topics were dealt with by stalwarts in the field, with lot of interaction from the participants. The conference valedictory was a short function, with awards being presented to the various winners. Awards were given under four categories for the Oral Presentations, and under five categories for the e-Poster presentations, apart from the Video Presentations. Cash awards are being given to all the winners, in an effort to encourage the younger generation.

While the conference was organised by the Department of Surgical Oncology, NEIGRIHMS, it was supported by the Northeast India Association of Surgical Oncology(NASO), which was newly formed and launched by the Health Minister during the inaugural function. 'Surgery is the main treatment for cancer, and development of surgical oncology in Northeast India will sure enable better services in this region, which has a very high incidence of cancer', said Dr. Caleb Harris, who is the secretary of NASO. Dr. JoydeepPurkayastha, the President of NASO, remarked that Northeast India has among the highest incidences of cancer in the country.

This conference gave a lot of impetus to get together surgical oncologists of Northeast India. Two organising committee meetings were held at Guwahati, with some participating on hybrid mode, with a short Scientific presentation, preceding the business discussions. In the run up to the conference, a satellite event, 'Surgical Oncology Workshop cum CME' was held at Jorhat Medical College, Jorhat(Assam), under the IASO banner, on December 20th, 2021. Three surgeries(hepatectomy, esophagectomy, mastectomy/chemoport) were demonstrated, followed by a CME for the postgraduates in Surgery and MBBS students. This was the first foray for Surgical Oncology as a speciality in a hitherto unserved area of the country. This event raised awareness not only on cancer care, but also generated interest for the conference.

Dr. Ravi Kannan, the organising secretary, in his welcome address, acknowledged the efforts of all the abstract presenters and their mentors. Dr. Caleb Harris, organising secretary thanked all the members of the Organising Committee and the IASO executive committee for their support, and God almighty, for enabling smooth conduct of the conference.
