

Dear IASO members

Cancer patients diagnosed with cancer in India per year is reaching to almost fifteen lakh new cases per year and more than half of these patients are dying of cancer sooner or later. Non- uniformity of treating facilities across the country making it difficult for cancer control. Canceronomics is a big challenge today with high rise of treatment cost and affordability disparity. Most of these cancers are solid tumors and cancer surgery is an integral part of the treatment and contributes significantly to the survival of the patient as R0 resection only way to achieve the desired outcome.

India is vast country with variable treatment facility at first second and tier three cities. For the country at large, proper training in cancer surgery and availability of trained man power in cancer surgery are real needs of the hour with growing armamentarium like laparoscopic / robotic cancer surgery. At present per year nearly 350 new cancer surgeons are getting trained all across India. There are many hinderances in uniformity in training across country unable to give a backup bench strength for cancer control.

This includes issues like uneven distribution of the training facilities in the country, non- uniformity of training modules across various institutions, lacunae in skill and knowledge updation of the practicing surgical oncologists and lack of job opportunity for passing out cancer surgeons. Leaders in oncology heading various major institutes, many are members in committees deciding the curriculum of medical education and public health care in the country and many are involved in training a large number of surgeons in Surgical Oncology. I strongly feel that it is the responsibility of IASO is to act as conduit between these leaders who are also international stalwarts in surgical oncology, to young budding onco -surgeons and use their collective opinions, power and actions to create better environment for the younger onco-surgeons and cancer surgery in the country.

IASO now with the vibrant leadership is growing well and spreading its wing across India and abroad, by its efforts and also collaborating with many national and international associations like SSO ESSO BASO Brazil SO society.

Pancreas 360: Benign to Malgnant



Pancreas 360: Benign to Malgnant" was CME conducted at Hotel Cocoon Sangli on 15th and 16th June 2024. CME was organised by Surgical Society Sangli and Gokarna Oncology Association in collaboration with Deccan Surgical Society, IMA Sangli and Gut club Sangli.

The conference was well attended by 180 delegates. CME focussed on diseases of pancreas which are relevant to surgeons, oncosurgeons and gastroenterologists like acute and chronic pancreatitis, pancreatic stones, pancreatic malignancies, cystic tumors of pancreas, tips for pancreatic resections like Whipples and distal pancreatectomies and recent advances.

Dr. Shailesh Shrikhande, renowned pancreatic surgeon and deputy director Tata Memorial Centre, Dr. Manish Bhandare, young and dynamic pancreatic surgeon from TMC and Padmashree Dr. Amit Maydeo, famous gastroenterologist from Mumbai were guest faculty. Rest of the local and regional faculty also addressed the gathering to cover 360 degree views of pancreatic disease management.

Dear Colleagues,

On behalf of the Indian Association of Surgical Oncology (IASO), we express our deepest condolences and solidarity in the wake of the tragic and heinous act of rape and murder of the lady doctor at R G Kar Medical College Hospital in Kolkata on 09-08-2024. This abhorrent crime has left the medical community in shock and grief, and we stand united with the Indian Medical Association (IMA) and the broader medical fraternity in condemning this senseless violence.

President in Chair called meeting to be in order.

1. Natcon 2024 Update -

Dr SVS Deo updated about the preparation of NATCON 2024 Bengaluru. He updated about the satisfactory progress on registration status (> 700), orations, scientific format and sponsorship.

2. IJSO Election :-

President & Secretary shared the list of nominations received for the IJSO Editor- in -Chief and Joint editor posts. Dr Deo informed the EC that he has received resignation of IJSO Executive editor Dr M Vijay Kumar, hence there is an urgent need to advertise the nomination application for the post of Executive Editor (01) also.

Dr P K Das, Dr Sharad Desai, Dr Rudra P Acharya and other EC Members seconded the decision to advertise Executive editor post after august 15th and give 2 to 3 weeks' time for submission of nominations.

After completion of nomination process a zoom meeting of IJSO selection committee members will be organized for shortlisting editorial board members before 15th September and a final decision will be taken during NATCON 2024 Bengaluru .

3. IASO Election:

Dr. Rudra Acharya informed the EC that IASO election notification has already been circulated through emails and newsletter and the secretariat is receiving the nominations. Election process will be completed in September as per IASO advertisement under supervision of President, President Elect and Vice president and secretary (Dr Sharad Desai—Election Officer).

4. Orations –

Prof Deo updated the EC regarding proposed Orators for NATCON 2024 And all EC members approved unanimously.

- II. NC Misra Oration- Dr Felipe Coimbra, Brazil
- III. R S Rao Oration- Dr Deepak Parikh, Mumbai

5. Proposal for Dr Ashok Mehta Oration

In continuation of earlier discussions and approvals by IASO EC & GB regarding Dr Ashok Mehtas offer to Donate 10 Lacs for instituting an Oration in his name and to replace Radha Devi oration with Ashok Mehta Oration a request was made by Dr Ashok Mehta for converting the proposed Dr Ashok Mehta oration for lifetime as is being done for other orations. Dr R .Toprani (IASO Past President) who was coordinating with Dr Ashok Mehta, appraised all the members to revisit previous EC and GB decisions and convert Dr Ashok Mehta Oration to Life time oration as being done for other orations. He also emphasized the contributions of Dr Ashok Mehta for IASO as founding secretary and poor response for instituting new orations and donating money. The Proposal for the conversion of Oration for life term was proposed by Prof SVS Deo and seconded by all executive members and Past president P K Das. A decision was taken to intimate Dr Ashok Mehta regarding lifetime oration and get the proposal approved by GB during NATCON 2024.

After GBM, an MOU will be signed with Dr Ashok Mehta and 10 lacs donation will be accepted by IASO. So NATCON 2025 onwards, Radha devi oration will be converted to Dr Ashok Mehta oration focusing on head & neck cancers.

Motibhai oration will be converted to past president oration.

6. BASO Collaboration

Prof. Deo informed the EC that he has received a letter of interest from British Association of Surgical Oncologist (UK) for collaboration with IASO. Dr Raghuram P who was coordinating this collaboration earlier (2008) was invited as a special invitee for the detailed discussion on BASO proposal. He informed the EC that BASO is willing for a Fellow exchange program with matched financial commitments from both societies.

"BASO has agreed to revive the Fellowship Programme with IASO. They have agreed to fund a trainee from the UK to participate at IASO annual meeting by way of presenting a Poster and he/she will spend a week at a centre of excellence in India based upon her subspecialty interest. BASO will provide a travel grant of Rs 1, 00, 000. On a similar note, BASO has agreed for a trainee from India selected by virtue of merit to participate at BASO Annual Congress and spend a week at a centre of excellence in the UK. They expect IASO will match the travel grant of Rs 1, 00, 000 to the Indian trainee"

Dr Deo proposed that this award should be given to young faculty or consultants (Early career award) who are IASO members and less than 45 years old. All EC members supported the proposal and a decision has been taken to intimate BASO regarding IASO willingness for collaboration with BASO and put forward proposal for GBM approval.

7. IASO- NOGU Collaboration

Dr. Deo informed the EC that he has received expression of interest from Prof Arul Immanuel (Professor of Robotic Surgery, Consultant Oesophago-Gastric Surgeon) for an academic collaboration between Northern Oesophago-Gastric Unit (NOGU), Royal Victoria Infirmary, Queen Victoria Road, Newcastle upon Tyne (UK) and IASO. This MoU would be executed between NOGU and IASO and will focus on Early Career Faculty/consultant exchange program in the field of "Robotic/ MIS Oesophageal and Gastric surgeries". Dr Ashutosh Mishra has been asked to coordinate with NOGU for further proceedings. The detailed draft of MoU will be shared with EC for approval.

The said proposal was welcomed by all EC members and will be put for further intimation of General Body during NATCON 2024.



8. IASO Research Agenda – Roadmap

In continuation of earlier discussions on said agenda and vision document circulated by e-newsletter, Prof Deo and Dr Manish highlighted the need for formation of dedicated research committee, including members of IASO leadership/ office bearers, one EC member from each zone and eminent researchers / statisticians from other fields as invited / nominated members . This committee will focus on collaborative research initiatives by IASO members / institutions, National Surgical Oncology Data base creation, data pooling , joint publications ect. All the EC members welcomed the proposal to form a "IASO Research Committee" under the chairmanship of Prof SVS Deo. The above proposal seconded by all EC Members.

9. Update on Brazil Visit





Toy Story Channapatna Wooden Toys Factory

Channapatna toys are a form of wooden toys (and dolls) that are manufactured in the town of Channapatna in the Bangalore Rural district of Karnataka state, India. This traditional craG is protected as a geographical indication (GI) under the World Trade Organization, administered by the Government of Karnataka. As a result of the popularity of these toys, Channapatna is known as GombegalaOoru (toytown) of Karnataka. Traditionally, the work involved lacquering the wood of the Wrightiatinctoria tree, colloquially called Aalemara (ivory-wood).

The origin of these toys can be traced to the reign of Tipu Sultan who invited artisans from Persia to train the local artisans in the making of wooden toys. BavasMiyan is the father of Channapatna Toy. He is the one to sacrifice his life for channapatna toys. He adopted Japanese technology for toys making and help the local artisans improve their art. For nearly two centuries, ivory-wood was the main wood used in the making of these toys, though rosewood and sandalwood were also occasionally used.

Dodda Alada Mara "The Big Banyan Tree"

The DoddaAlada Mara means a big Banyan tree. It is a giant 400 year old Banyan tree located in the village of Kethohalli/Ramohalli in the Bangalore Urban district in Karnataka. This single plant covers 3 acres (12,000 sq.m) and is one of the largest of its kind. It has a crown circumference of more than 250 meters and has more than a thousand perial roots. In the 2000s, the main root of the tree succumbed to natural disease, and now it gives the impression of there being many different trees. The Big Banyan Tree is positioned at a distance of 28 km from Bangalore towards Mysore Road. Nearby to the historical banyan tree is a Mukthi Naga Temple of Navagraha in the form of Naga. It is the world's largest monolithic statue of Lord Naga. This 7 headed idol is about 16 feet tall & 36 tons of weight. ShriMukthi Naga Kshetra has long been the home for the Serpent deity. As per the legend, the devotees used to make 9 prodakshinas around the "hutta" (anthill) where the serpent resides, to get their desires fulfilled within 90 days. The residents of this region have been referring to this place as "JunjappanaBayalu" (Junjappa's field)

Visit To Shri Veerabhadra Swami Temple At Lepakshi

Lepakshi is a small village located in the Anantapur District, in AP & is approximately 123 kms north of Bengaluru. It is a historical & archaeological site with temples dedicated to Hindu gods & the huge Nandi Bull made of a single Granite stone. The most astonishing architectural marvel of Lepakshi is the Hanging Pillar of Veerabhadra Temple. The pillar does not rest on the ground completely but hangs in the air, with enough space between its base and the ground to pass a sheet of paper or a small twig through it-fully to emerge on the other side! Out of the 70 pillars at the stone temple, in the Vijayanagar style of architecture by brothers Virupanna and Veeranna, this particular pillar stands out as a triumphant masterpiece of architecture. The Archaeological Survey of India has proven that this pillar was not constructed as a mistake, but was built intentionally to prove the brilliance of the builders of the time.

Melkote Temple

Life in the devout Hindu town of Melukate (Melkate), about 50km north of Mysuru, revolves around the 12th-century Cheluvanarayana Temple, with its rose-colouredgopuram (gateway tower) and ornately carved pillars. This temple town is 50 kms away from Mysore and is often considered to be the home of Sanskrit Scholars. Melukate hosts many temples with beautiful carvings. On this tour away from the hustle & bustle of city life, explore this temple town & its rich customs. CheluvanarayanaSwamy Temple is over 1000 years old. The engravings on the temple mention the historical evidence of the temple. On one of the columns of navaranga is a bas relief, of Raja Wodeyar. This name is etched on the base. He was said to be a great devotee of the presiding delty and a constant visitor to the temple. Cheluvanarayana Swamy Temple is a lavishly empowered temple by the Wodeyar dynasty, the Royals of Mysore. The temple has the most valuable collection of jewels given to the lord by Mysore king Raja Wodeyar. Wodeyars gifted two gold crowns Known as Vairamudi or Vajramukuta and Krishnaraja- mudi to the lord. There is another crown, much older than these two crowns gifted to the lord by some unknown person. All the three crowns are currently in the custody of the Government and are brought to the temple on special occasions.


UlsoorLake


Chikkamagalur
